

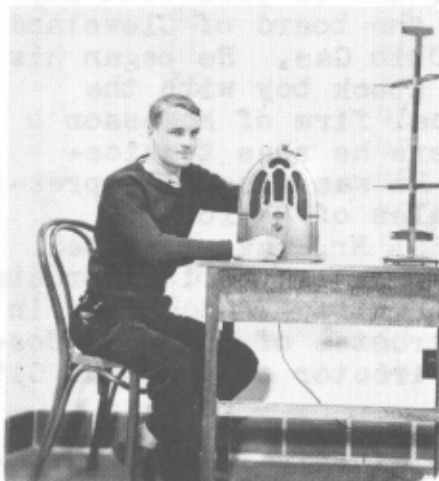

DUDLEY TAW '34



Dudley J. Taw is president and chairman of the board of Cleveland based East Ohio Gas. He began his career as a stock boy with the pharmaceutical firm of McKesson & Robbins, where he rose to vice-president. He was also vice-president for sales of Revlon.

After JMHS, Mr. Taw graduated from Hiram College. He is a trustee for WVIZ-TV Public Broadcasting in Cleveland, trustee of Lakewood Hospital, and director of National City Bank.

East Ohio Gas serves 980,000 customers in northeast Ohio and had revenues totaling \$960 million.

Mr. Taw is married to the former Louise Forshey of the June '35 class

Feel like an early retirement? At age 31, Joseph F. Hrudka retired from the Mr. Gasket Company in 1971. He founded the company with only \$5 in 1965 and later sold it for \$18 million. Mr. Hrudka was recently inducted into the Automotive Hall of Fame.

He now has the time to enjoy retirement. Always interested in cars, he has a collection of 100. He pays particular attention to every aspect of life. He personally trained the caretakers for his house. Conservation was one of his best classes at JMHS. His instructor was William Tomko, now principal of Marshall.

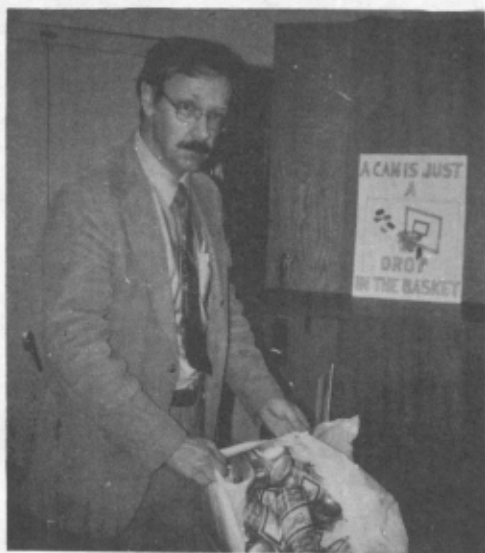
