Despite the fact that she could not read English, she worked diligently and graduated with a 3.0 GPA. She has been accepted at KSU, CSU and Ursuline and has a goal of becoming a pediatric nurse.

While at JMH Aziza was a member of the Air Force ROTC program and participated in service projects in the community. She was a member of the ASPIRE Nursing Program where she had hands on learning experiences. One of her teachers comments that Aziza "she recognizes that many hospitals lack Swahili speaking nurses and doctors. She understands how difficult it is to show up at a medical facility and to not know what is happening. She hopes to make a difference in the Swahili speaking community."

Aziza was an active member in the Teen Refugee Response Program while at JMH and received High Honors during her senior year. While not in school, Aziza enjoys singing in the Hope Free Will Methodist Swahili Church Choir.

Alanis Marie Lebron Flecha

Jack Bird, Friend of '69, Adairsville, GA keeps in touch with class of 1969 even though he moved away when the state took their house before his junior year.


