Jaylin plans to attend Cleveland State University and hopes to own a business one day. She graduated with a 3.8 GPA and was fourth in her class. She achieved

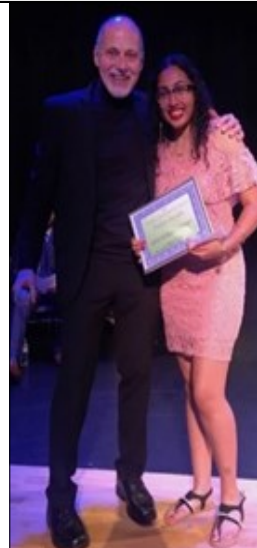

Plamedie plans to attend CCC to major in Forensic Science Technology. She would like to work in the Forensic Science field. Plamedie graduated with a 3.2

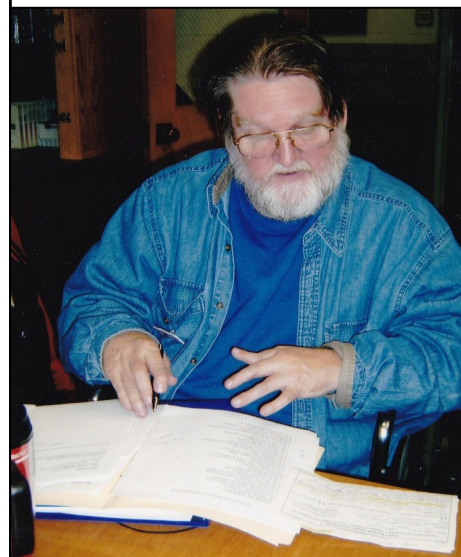

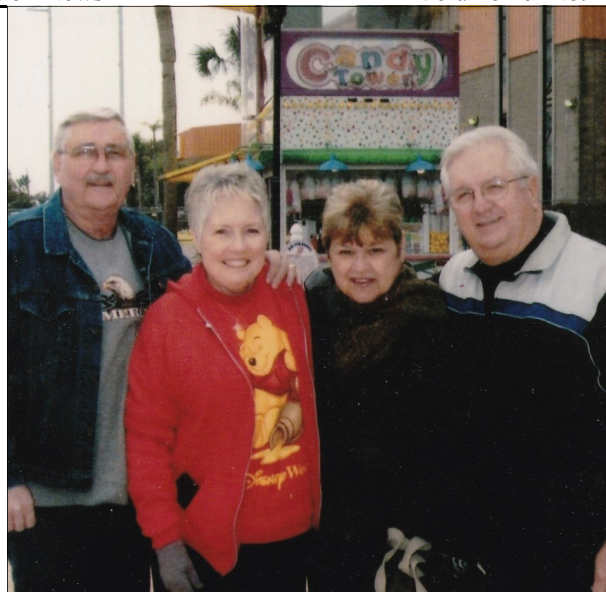
