Ralph A. Pfingsten—November 22, 1939 - March 25, 2021

Ralph Pfingsten was a retired science teacher, author, and historian. He taught science for 25 years at his Alma Mater, John Marshall High School (Class of January 1958 and Hall of Fame Inductee, 2005), and was responsible for establishing the Alumni Association in 1985.

He was also a founding member of the West Park Historical Society and well known in the West Park area as the author of many books and articles. Ralph wrote the history of West Park, From Rockport to West Park in 2004, before penning The History of John Marshall High School in 2007. Many other publications followed. The West Park Historical Society has a new book coming out in 2023 that you may be interested in. We are in process of republishing, in its entirety, a 104-page book originally printed in 1923, named "Echoes" for its 100th Anniversary. This book covers many stories of West Park High School in 1923, and the surrounding West Park area, before it was named John Marshall High School.

CONGRATULATIONS to the 2022 Inductees from John Marshall High School to CLEVELAND LEGENDS CMSD Hall of Fame.

Jonathan Burrell (Track & Field) - The Senate Athletic League has produced many double event sprinters, but Jonathan Burrell might be the best since Jesse Owens. Burrell was so gifted that his 60-meter dash (6.65) record was broken a few years ago at Ohio State University, a history that lasted 23 years. Jonathan started winning championships immediately, winning the 1991 and 1992 Ohio Division I Track Team Championships. He won back-to-back 100-meter dash titles and set a state record in the 4x100 relay. In 1993, his senior year at the Ohio State High School Track Championship, a power runner struck fear in his competitions, struck gold, and won the 100 meters and 200-meter dash. Jonathan competed in the USA Junior Outdoor Track Championship, running 10.38 in the 100 meters dash, one of the top times in the nation. He also competed in the Olympic Sports Festival on the amateur circuit.

Michelle Stoyka (Track & Field) - The first Ohio State Girls Track Championship was in 1975. For a girl from the Cleveland Public school, learning how to high jump was rare. Stoyka was John Marshall's only qualifier for the state meet that year; in 1979, she represented Marshall High School and the Cleveland School District. She made them proud of her 2nd place in the high jump. Stoyka returned for her senior year in 1980 and competed for a tie but returned with the runner-up title due to more misses. Michelle earned a track scholarship to Kent State University, where she completed her career. According to the OHSAA records, in 42 years of girl's state meet competition, only four female high jumpers from the Cleveland Public School have placed in the state championship.

Linda J. Beebe (Volleyball) - The first Ohio State Volleyball Championship occurred in 1975. Coach Beebe recruited girls was limited to only Senate league play. Beebe quickly molded inexperienced volleyball athletes, and they were able to compete in two years and ready for state competition. Coach Beebe's team advanced to the District Championship; they continued that success in the Bowling Green Regional Championship by defeating Toledo DeVilbiss High School (16-14) and (15-11). Her team finally moved on to Regional Finals, defeating Celina High school (15-3) and (15-13). A Cleveland Public School history qualified for a state final four for the first time. John Marshall matches up with Stow High defeating them two games out of three. Coach Beebe coached the team to the Ohio High School State Volleyball Championship, losing to Kettering Fairmount West High School. John Marshall won the State Runner-up trophy.

We have about 20 former MH guys that participate in this causal weekly event. **Bill Arthrell**, a former history teacher at JMH has passed. He is remembered as a renowned protester. Bill was one of 1,500 protesters at Kent State University when the National Guard opened fire, he had just turned 21. He'd gone to the protest with another student who was seriously wounded when he was shot by a guardsman.

He went on to earn a master's degree in education from Cleveland State University. After graduating from Kent he taught history off and on in the Cleveland Schools before retiring. Prior to his death he wrote a list of things he was most proud of in his life in his journal that included, being courageous, being outrageous, being a leader in the peace movement. Taking dangerous adventures, and doing it alone, almost like Indiana Jones. My sense of loyalty and willingness to try new things were listed, along with quitting drinking years ago and living around the world. The picture of The Riverside Theatre in last year's newsletter brought back many a good memory from some of the JMH alumni. We thought you'd enjoy reading them!

Glen Horton Jr. 6/46 Yes, I remember the Riverside Theater very well. My sisters and I went to the opening with our neighbors the Jenkins on W. 162nd St. As I remember up until then we had gone to the old West Park just west of the new Riverside. I was twelve and my ticket cost 10 cents. Adults were 25 cents. The penny candy store that used to be by the old West Park moved up right beside the entrance of the new theater. After the opening in 1940 I think we went to the show every Saturday matinee to be sure to see the serial the Lone Ranger and his side kick companion, Tonto, with their horses, Silver and Scout. We would sit through the movie twice. There was a special elevated box of seats on the eastside of the ground floor where we always sat. There was one seat all by itself in front of the long box where we took turns sitting. I also remember there was a lotto night where patrons could win dishes. That's what I recall. I also remember there was a time the old West Park Theater was closed and we had to go down to W 117th St. to the Variety Theater. That is where my parents took me to see my first "moving picture." I had no idea how you made a picture move when I was five years old. But I do remember the movie, Tugboat Annie, with Wallace Berry. The cartoons were Steamboat Willie (Mickey Mouse). That had to be in 1933. Excuse my memory if I don't get all the names correct. So, you see the movies were a big part of my growing up in the old West Park. Carol V LaBelle 6/51 I enjoy reading all the news about the alumni and look forward to the next years copy. It was great to see a picture of the Riverside Theater we all were a part of. I remember sitting in the front row and enjoying being with friends. Thank you for keeping us informed.

Leo Morozki 1/52 Yes, I remember all of the Riverside Theater as if it was yesterday for sure. Notable as follows, entry fee 15 cents circa 1948, popcorn 5 cents. 


