From the President's Desk.....

Many of your current JMH Alumni Association Trustees have volunteered on the committee between ten and twenty years or more. Every year we pride ourselves in publishing an annual Newsletter for you, the Alumnae. Our yearly newsletter is designed to keep you informed of Class Reunions, classmate updates, events and death notices.

This past year, the Scholarship Endowment fund had a good year due to the stock market returns, brick sales and some very generous donations from alumni directed to the students. However, we noticed that the donations toward our Operating Fund decreased drastically, making it the lowest ever in the past 10 years. The actual number of donors was less than 1.5% of the 18,000 receiving newsletters.

We have never charged for our publication or required a membership fee, nor do we wish to do so. We are, however, counting on you to consider sending in any donation to keep your newsletter coming. Please take the time to support your alumni association! We depend on you!

The building ...

The new John Marshall High building is still on schedule and will be open in August 2015. Ninety to one-hundred construction workers are in the home stretch each day putting the finishing touches on the building. Many of the rooms have been painted and the lights installed. Currently wall mounted cabinets are being installed.

Educational trends and programs have changed throughout the district in the past few years. Everyone has wondered what the new JMH will hold for our students. Currently the plan is for the school to consist of three small schools. There will be a school of Information Technology, a school of Business and Civic Leadership and a School of Engineering. Each school will have its own principal. It also appears at this time that the ninth grade will return to the high school, instead of being at Shuler as the ninth grade

academy. The transition to the 'schools' will be gradual, as the current juniors and seniors will still attend JMH, in the existing comprehensive program. Eventually all students will be enrolled in one of the three school programs, thus making JMH another school of choice within the district.

The football field has been used as a parking lot for the construction workers for the last two years. Once all construction is done, the field will at least be returned to its preexisting condition, but the 2015 home football games will still be played at Rhodes field. There may be a possibility of new stand construction, but naturally funding has to be preapproved.

The cafetorium—currently being used for assembly of cabinets and other items that need to be placed in the building.

A Familiar Face

While we usually don't focus on any 'one' alumnae's passing, this one is special—as many will remember him for his many years of being seen about the West Park neighborhood.

His name was **Robert Jankulov, a 6/69** graduate, but we all knew him as 'Popcorn'. Sadly, he passed away last March 29. Excerpts from his obit: "A popular and unique individual, Popcorn was a familiar sight for over 30 years in Cleveland's West Park area. An avid bike rider, Robert was often seen riding his bike throughout the far west side neighborhoods. Robert was so well known for his bike riding, that the school newspaper featured him in an article entitled "Bike traveling senior peddles many a mile." A Cleveland policeman was quoted as saying "We see that kid on his bike everywhere." Since graduation, he worked for the Cleveland Water Department until early retirement in 1992 due to many health issues. Even in retirement, he continued riding his colorful bike. He later switched to a four wheel motorized cart and regularly traveled around Lorain & W. 140th St. In 2002, when asked about his future plans, his response was always the same "Keep Going!"
