



St. The school was shaped in the form of the letter "E", a shape that is not so apparent in the aerial photographs below.

Coming Soon: The History of John Marshall High School by Ralph Pfingsten

What was the size of the largest class? How about the smallest? Who scored the most touchdowns in a single game? How many Chairmen of the Math Department have there been? When was Marshall built? (careful, this may be a trick question). How many people have graduated from John Marshall? Who holds the single game scoring record for boy's basketball? Would it surprise you to know that Franklin Cover was active in Drama at Marshall? How many valedictorians have there been? (this is a trick question). How many teachers have there been?

Soon you will be able to answer these and hundreds of other questions about your alma mater. The long awaited *History* of *John Marshall* should be available sometime in late summer to early fall. Cost is yet to be determined and only 2,000 copies will be printed. There are hundreds of photographs covering every aspect of the school. The theme centers on the three basic parts of any school including the building, the faculty and the pupils. Some of the chapters include: The early history (West Park High School); Building the New School; The Junior Highs and Elementary Schools; The Faculty; The Pupils; Drama and Music; Sports; Night School and PTA; Alumni Association and Hall of Fame.

As many of you know, this project was started in 1997 while we were preparing for the centennial celebration in 1999. Someone said "wouldn't it be nice to have a history of the school for the centennial?" I got

the project by default not having any idea what I was getting in to. I soon discovered that the community and the school were so entwined that everything overlapped. As the work continued, it became apparent that there was too much information for a single work and that it had to be split into two projects. *From Rockport to West Park* became available in late 2004 and spawned the formation of a West Park Historical Society. Now the *History of John Marshall* will soon appear.
