The End of an Era!

Just one year shy of celebrating its 80th anniversary, this venerable building on West 140th will close its doors to its students, faculty, staff, alumni, and neighbors. The walls will come down and a new 'green', energy efficient building will be erected.

Many rumors have been floating around the last few years of where and how the new building would appear on this property. Let's set a few things straight. The question of Historic Registry has come up. The Registry is a Federal program with no bearing on JMH. JMH has been designated a Cleveland Landmark, which can be made or dropped by any councilman. Plans were considered to keep the existing building open, which would save with logistics of housing students elsewhere, while building on the football field along W 143rd St. That met with opposition from the neighborhood—those behind didn't want a looming structure out their front windows—those along 140th didn't like the idea of a football field in their front yard. The capped gas well in the middle of the field came up as well, but few knew that there is also a vented well within the building. Those issues will be addressed during construction.

Having a new building presents many advantages, but there are disadvantages that will be evident among alumni. The new structure will be three stories high along W 140th. Each floor will have identical classrooms, restrooms, offices, etc. If there is a lab on the first floor, there will be one in the same position on the second and third floors. This echoes academic plans that are currently being addressed across the country. The north end, main floor of the building, will house the offices. On the upper floors will be art rooms, which will benefit from the northern light. The actual main entrance will be about where the auditorium is now—students would enter and go to their left to go to classrooms and to their right would be the gyms, cafetorium, library and other general 'public' areas. There are two large gyms and several smaller 'training' or 'practice' areas. The cafetorium is a multi-purpose area—cafeteria during most of the day, study hall (?) and auditorium when necessary. The square footage is larger than our current auditorium and the stage area would be about 30% larger. All technology will meet and maybe even exceed what exists today. Overall, the school will meet several levels of 'LEEDS' certification—which focuses on energy savings, water

efficiency, indoor environmental quality, reduced CO2 emissions, use of resources and sensitivity to their impacts.

The disadvantages—no longer will there be an indoor track, no pool, and no auditorium with fixed, elevated seating. These are some of the items that made John Marshall unique among the city schools.

Many people—staff, alumni, neighbors, have all expressed a desire to merge some of the existing structural features with the new building. The eagles atop the front façade, the carved school name, the lone urn (one of the pair from the 38 class), the decorative tile in the main office area, the metalwork by the auditorium, the commemorative plaques, and some of the other stonework from the front façade are hoped to be incorporated. The architects did not know of the mural in the cafeteria—but at this time, we're not sure if it salvageable—that wall area was changed in the 80's or 90's to bring the school in to the current 'age'. If it is salvageable—would it 'fit' in the new design?

The students will be housed at the two 'swing' school sites. The 9th grade will be at Brooklawn. There will be additional modular classrooms added this summer and an extended cafeteria area as well. The 10th—12th grade will be at Carl F Shuler. Sixteen modular classrooms will be added, parking lots expanded to house staff vehicles, and students will be able to park at a church a couple blocks away. By no means, will students have to go outside to go to their classes—the mention of modular or temporary brings up visions of schools in warmer climates, but particularly the overcrowding in Cleveland schools in the 40's and 50's. These modular classrooms will be comparable to the existing classrooms, lavatories will be added, and a hallway will be constructed between them and the existing building. Traffic patterns and street parking will be altered to make the neighborhood remain as normal as possible during the day.

To celebrate the many years that this building has serviced this community, we will sponsor a Farewell Open House on Saturday, May 7, 2011. Ralph Pfingsten will have several

presentations on the History of John Marshall, the JMH History books will be available for sale, as well as Ralph's other books, a portion of each sale contributes to general operations fund, Alumni Merchandise—shirts, caps, magnets, etc. will be available as well.

We hope that as many former teachers and staff, along with current faculty members can join us to walk the halls and reminisce. We are sure there are many stories that could be told. All former students, parents, neighbors and friends are welcome to attend. Plans are in the works for a brick sale (obviously, we can't provide them yet!), a video is being recorded and may be available that day, or for ordering, and maybe even a collection of memories to be compiled in to a book. To make the day eventful several plans are still in the works and times have to be nailed down, but we will be there to greet you!

We expect many to join us on May 7th, so please consider car pooling! Parking will be at a premium! Bring your camera, your walking shoes, and your memories!

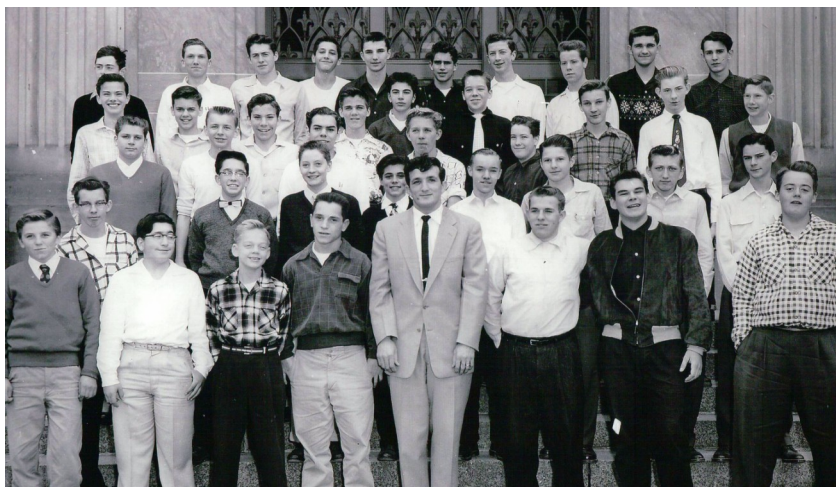
