From the President's Desk

GONE....BUT NOT FORGOTTEN!

After many years of planning, a delay from 2011 until 2012, John Marshall High School has been totally taken down. Over its 80 years, many changes and additions had been made to the building. The building had been staffed with many very talented teachers, more than 30,000 students graduated and many went on to distinguished careers. A new John Marshall High will open in its place in August of 2015. The new school will have less square feet than the 2012 structure, but similar to the original building in size of 1932. There will be two gyms, but no swimming pool, underground track or auditorium. There will be a Cafetorium, which includes a stage that opens on to the cafeteria. (A great addition to any elementary school).

In May 2012 the final open house was held at JMHS. By that time, trophies and important plaques had already been removed from the school, some in our possession, others in a secure location. Through May and June, materials were packed up, with designations for storage or to go to the JMHS temporary home, known as a swing site with the district, at Carl F Shuler. The mural in the back of the cafeteria was found when part of the ceiling and back wall was removed. It was unable to be saved, but it was well documented.



While JMHS was being prepared for demolition, during the summer at Carl F. Shuler, several areas were gutted and rebuilt to handle 1,100 high school students. To accommodate chemistry and computer labs, everything was removed and replaced with new and functional materials. The gymnasium floor was repaired.



Sixteen modular class rooms were added to the west side of the building. This was a big job to complete by mid August. At times, it took two shifts working six days a week to finish up on time. They just barely completed the external

areas when students began arriving on August 22nd. As students arrived, last minute interior issues were being completed.

Back at Marshall, asbestos was being abated. During October and November, all recyclable copper wire and copper pipes were removed. All aluminum grating, granite steps, and art work carved into the upper lime stone, was secured for reuse.



The large urn from the front steps, one remaining of a pair donated by the Class of 1938, was moved and will be utilized on the grounds. The lime stone doorways at the north and south sides of the building were removed for use in the new building.

By the end of November, the Gym/Pool addition was opened up. The outer wall material was crushed and placed around the main building as a 'destruction' road, to accommodate the heavy equipment on the soft ground.

Meet JMH's New Principal! Mr. Byron D. Hopkins



On January 14, 2013, Mr. Byron D. Hopkins became the 19th principal in John Marshall history. Mr. Hopkins is a Cleveland native, graduating in 1989 from St. Joseph's (now known as Villa Angela/St. Joseph). He attended Thiel University in Greenville, PA, receiving his Business Administration degree in 1992. While there, he was the President of Black Collegiates, a service organization that focused on giving back to the community by tutoring at Mercer Elementary.

Upon his return to Ohio, he received his Masters at KSU and taught business classes. The education field was knocking at his

door—he subbed at Harry E Davis, worked at South High School, and was then hired by South Euclid/Lyndhurst Schools to teach business classes. He furthered his education by receiving his EDS at CSU. Mr. Hopkins has been with the CMSD for 6 years—2 years as an Assistant Principal at Whitney Young and the next 4 as a Unit Principal at East Tech, where he first met Mr. Johnson. He travels daily from Solon, where he lives with his wife and 2 teenage children, both attending Solon HS.

He is pleased to be at JMH—he has found that it has a committed staff and great young people. With the right support, he will continue working to make Marshall a school of excellence once again.

We did receive some good news from the demolition company. They were not able to save the whole Mosaic, created by the students in the early 2000's, but they did save the larger painted pieces.

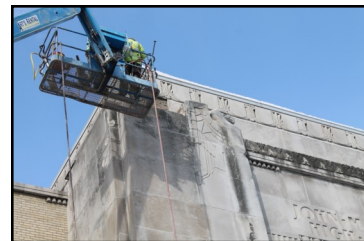


We hope that it can be recreated in some capacity in the new building—maybe not as large, but bringing a recent contribution from students to the new building.



By mid January many windows were removed from the main building along W. 140 St., allowing a view to the rear of the property.

Throughout February, interior walls were destroyed and shoveled out the openings by mini dozers. The crown molding, medallions, the eagles (each weighing about 6300 lbs.), and



other architectural features were removed and secured. Some will be reincorporated in the building—interior and exterior, and others may be used for artwork planned along the W 140th St. 'Education' corridor, a project that the Bellaire Puritas Development Corporation is promoting.



Around Valentine's Day, the 1970 addition (pool & gym), the 1964 addition (girl's new gym, auto shops, little theater with band, choir, shop rooms above), the auditorium, and the north wing

were down. By the end of February, all that remained was the rubble. March was spent removing debris, capping the gas well which had been vented through the building, and preparing the area for groundbreaking, which is expected to begin April 1st.

Not only has JMH lost its building, but its 18th principal. In November 2012, Mr. Luther Johnson took a position downtown as Interim Academic Superintendent for the CMSD. His temporary replacement was Mr. Dale Laux. We sadly say goodbye to Mr. Johnson. It was a pleasure working with him over the last two years, but yet we congratulate him on his promotion.

On January 14th Mr. Byron D Hopkins started as the (19th) Interim JMHS principal. We are eager to 'break in' Mr. Hopkins!

And now, on to a New Beginning.....

On to a fresh start....

Computer generated photos and renderings below were shared by Jeff Henderson, the architect with TDA ThenDesignArchitecture. These latest designs of the new building are quite different than what was shared two years ago. You can view these closer on the Bellaire Puritas Development Corporation website.

The first one is the 'Alumni Hall' basically separating the academic and community sections of the building. If you look closely, you can see some medallions on the upper left wall, the cornice and shell designs as benches along the left side, some metalwork from the exterior of the building as artwork, and the door frames from the north and south end of the building.



The above rendering is of the 140th St. view. Several medallions are interspersed between the 1st and 2nd floors and the eagles, which towered over the front door, will sit at ground level around the 'ornamental entrance' to the building.



The final rendering shows the view of the main entrance from Viola. The art rooms are at the north end of the building, offices are in the same location on each floor in relationship to the main entrance, community classrooms (labs, media center) are in the center of the building and to the right is the 'Alumni Hall' and the gyms, band room, cafeteria, kitchen and facilities operations.

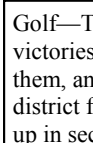

1970 GLORY DAYS

Glory days ... We have all been there at one time or another, but the Class of '70 had a season to remember with the JMH JV Football Team in the fall of '67.

I remember being 62 out of 64 pre-season selected players and ending up being a first string defensive linebacker and a first string offensive guard. This was totally different than being one of the last chosen and battling non-stop with 46 other teammates in 26 of 28 quarters, only stepping out at halftime during a Marshall 38 -0 beat-down of Lincoln, in a field of mud and pouring rain. let us not forget the second half of that Lincoln game when Kevin Dejean took over the helm as Quarterback.

I remember blood stained fist guards and jerseys, a Dave Diamond broken leg and Ross Bassett's broken fingers, collateral damage that would make you realize quickly that this was a game of controlled warfare and skilled strategy. Some teammates (myself included) couldn't make it through a geometry class. But understanding an 80 page playbook, skewed with multiple patterns of X's and O's and an array of other geometrical strategy symbols, that manipulated an equation to a different kind of end point, made total sense. This was especially true when calculations from a Mike McCreary, who would run that football through defensive backfields and make them look like fools. A Ron Cowie, whose eagle eyed perception of an endless array of calculated opponent formations, coupled with an offensive line and backfield that together, forged seventeen touchdowns that resulted in six Marshall victories. The ability to read offensive formations and calculate the defensive grid positioning by one Ray Petz, allowed a "no compromise" infliction of battle zone control by some of the Lawyer's toughest defenders, who in turn delivered four Marshall shutouts to the JV West Senate Conference.

This '70's team mettle, extracted from a half dozen area junior schools was engineered and led by Coach/Teacher Gary Montain. The team was dubbed by the Interpreter Staff as "Montain's Football Machine" shortly after the first few wins.

After a season of defensively shutting out Holy Name, West, Lincoln and West Tech, offensively destroying the Lincoln and South teams and winning the rivalry West Tech battle, this single era for the class of '70 would stand alone to be the only West Senate Football Conference co-championship in the 67, 68 and 69 Football seasons during the Class of '70 tenure at Marshall. The Lawyers only defeat was to Ignatius. Ignatius's only loss was to Holy Name, who the Lawyers easily defeated 14 - 0.

This outstanding performance by a brotherhood of 50 Marshall Lawyers and JV Head Coach Gary Montain deserves this recognition. The team roster and a letter from Coach Montain ensue.

LETTER FROM COACH MONTAIN:

The 1967 John Marshall J.V. football team finished the season with a record of six wins and one loss. This fine record won for them the conference co-championship of the West Senate. The defense yielded 7.43 points per game and had 4 shutouts. The offense averaged 18.3 points per game and had a dozen plays break for forty or more yards.

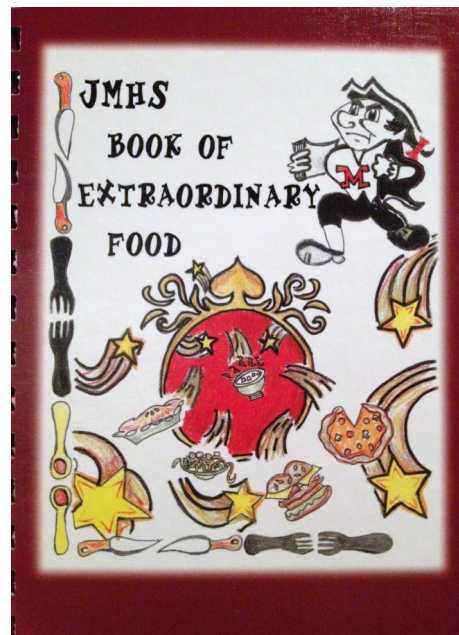


ball. She was also recognized as a Senior Standout in the PD on 5/20/12.

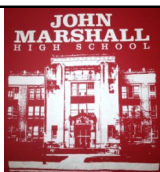

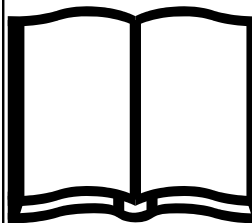
